Job Title: Head of Veterinary Services

An exciting job opportunity “Head of Veterinary Service” has arisen at the Charity’s Inchicore Clinic. The full-time permanent role will suit a dynamic and skilled professional to manage and lead a talented team of approximately 10 clinical staff in a well-equipped and modernised clinic.

The role also involves performing surgery and consultations, 2-3 morning per week.

The Irish Blue Cross is a long-established Dublin based animal welfare charity which helps pet owners in need of low-cost veterinary care for their pets through the Inchicore Small-Animal Clinic and the Mobile Veterinary Clinic Service.

The successful candidate will be a qualified veterinary surgeon, ideally with a minimum of 5-years’ experience who will have a positive, flexible and caring approach towards The Irish Blue Cross, its teams, clients and their pets.

Key Duties and Responsibilities of the Role:

- Act as the Charity’s Veterinary Council of Ireland Certificate Of Suitability holder for 11 clinics (Inchicore main Clinic and 10 once-weekly mobile clinic locations in Dublin)
- Act as Radiological Protection Officer and liaise with the EPA (office of radiological protection)
- Liaise with the Veterinary Defence Society, the Veterinary Council of Ireland, the Pet Emergency Hospital and others to meet professional codes of practice and day-to-day objectives
- Oversee best practice and ensure adherence to protocols and procedures to maintain high quality veterinary services throughout the Charity’s clinics
- Ensure compliance with regulations under the Veterinary Practice Act and The Animal Remedies Regulations
- Participate on animal welfare committees for The Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine and others and attend conferences on animal welfare

Inchicore Small-Animal Clinic & Mobile Veterinary Service,

- Act as consult/surgery vet at the Inchicore clinic on approximately 2-3 week-day mornings and as required
- Responsible for the day-to-day management of the veterinary team including communications, recruitment, induction training, roster development, appraisals and other Human Resources matters
- Responsible for veterinary services planning and resources, ensuring as many pets as possible benefit from services
- Ensure services reach eligible owners, and that client fees cover basis costs
- Oversee appointment bookings, accuracy of records and the daily caseload
- Oversee drug, consumables and equipment orders, ensuring savings
- Oversee the annual stock take

- Provide analyses and reports for sub-Committee Board and Board meetings
- Communicate with special interest groups, the general public, media, and attend conferences, receive training, etc
- Work within tight budgets, maintaining a low-cost approach through seeking discounts, sponsorship, and benefit-in-kind where possible, etc
- Participate in training and continued professional development to always be up-to-date with changes in veterinary medicine
- Work closely with the CEO and management team to plan and achieve targets

Essential skills and experience

- The ideal candidate will have 5 years veterinary experience, with demonstrated management in a fast paced small-animal veterinary practice
- Excellent veterinary consultation, surgery and record keeping skills
- Proven skills in leadership, operational and people management, planning, budgeting and decision-making
- Successful track record in managing a diverse and heavy workload as part of a team
- Excellent communication, literacy, numerical, IT and administrative skills
- Experience of working to strict deadlines and within health and safety protocols

Desirable skills and experience

- A track record of building and nurturing key relationships and partnerships within the veterinary sector

Other requirements

- Availability to take phone calls outside of work hours (e.g., in the event that a team member is unable to attend work, etc)
